Untactical guffawing by all probably could have been heard 50 meters away thru the jungle.

Let me know how we can increase membership. A social event should be planned to encourage new blood.



## JUNE HISTORICAL MOMENTS

### **JUNE 29, 2022, Oldest living Medal of Honor Winner – Hershel “Woody” Williams Loss of a great Marine**

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty as demolition sergeant serving with the 21st Marines, 3d Marine Division, in action against enemy Japanese forces on Iwo Jima, Volcano Islands, 23 February 1945. Quick to volunteer his services when our tanks were maneuvering vainly to open a lane for the infantry through the network of reinforced concrete pillboxes, buried mines, and black volcanic sands, Cpl. Williams daringly went forward alone to attempt the reduction of devastating machine-gun fire from the unyielding positions. Covered only by four riflemen, he fought desperately for four hours under terrific enemy small-arms fire and repeatedly returned to his own lines to prepare demolition charges and obtain serviced flamethrowers, struggling back, frequently to the rear of hostile emplacements, to wipe out one position after another. On one occasion, he daringly mounted a pillbox to insert the nozzle of his flamethrower through the air vent, killing the occupants, and silencing the gun; on another he grimly charged enemy riflemen who attempted to stop him with bayonets and destroyed them with a burst of flame from his weapon. His unyielding determination and extraordinary heroism in the face of ruthless enemy resistance were directly instrumental in neutralizing one of the most fanatically defended Japanese strongpoints encountered by his regiment and aided vitally in enabling his company to reach its objective. Cpl. Williams' aggressive fighting spirit and valiant devotion to duty throughout this fiercely contested action sustain and enhance the highest traditions of the U.S. Naval Service.



## PTSD

Post-traumatic stress disorder is a mental health condition triggered by a terrifying event causing flashbacks, nightmares and severe anxiety, behavioral-agitation irritability, hostility self-destructive behavior, or self-isolation. As members of the league, we need to ask some questions.

- 1 who has PTSD
- 2 what triggers it.

First let's look at the way we treat members both old and new.

Old first the first thing most of us did when we got out was let hair grow out. We are lucky if they are wearing shoes much less shine them.

New members we are trying to recruit, they aren't looking for someone to tell them what to wear or how to wear it. If that was what they were looking for they would have stayed in the Corps. I can see that dog trying to do a math problem look on your face, asking what this has to do with us.

Everyone has a form of PTSD (everyone) So when you make a suggestion to someone as to let's say their ribbons are over the over the wrong pocket don't do it in front of people and not in the I'm smarter than you voice.

There is a name for so called leaders who do that (no not that name) it is "name on the door syndrome" This is their way of making other people think they are as important as they themselves feel they are. This is the way they shine the name plate on the door.

Folks with PTSD will feel that you have shamed and embarrassed them and will walk away, and some will not come back. It may make you feel like a great leader, but it may cost us a member and them much more. They feel singled out when they need to be part of a group.

What have you done by shine the name on your door, all of us needs someone to talk too. As marines we need to be able to tell our stories: even when they start this is no bull shit We need to talk to people that know the difference between a 29er 2 and a M79. Yes, the older we get the better we were, but it maybe you need to tell a story next time. You have put yourself on high and not an equal, not someone that they can turn to without being judged. We must remember we are a brotherhood not on active duty. We need to stop wearing our ego over our left shirt pocket, "Who's also served that stand and wait" remember the Folks who never seen combat, wife, children, mothers, fathers, brothers, and sisters.

A chest full of medals means one of two things, you are a good trooper, or you were drinking buddies with the company clerk. Most marines can't remember if the purple heart goes before your good conduct ribbon and don't care, that is behind us. What we do know is the whiskey is strong and the beer is cold. Sometimes a warrior will keep an item from a friend that didn't come home, maybe a pin, medal, or rank insignia. They wear it to keep that person alive in their heart. "Survivors Remorse", is one of the most common forms of PTSD. They will wear the item everywhere, even the military understand this and make concessions. I was told once by a door shiner that the reason was if everyone was not in proper uniform that Semp Fi would not print the picture. After looking at the pictures in the magazine, I discovered that the last time I smell anything like that I was putting on the roses.

If you have ever been on the phone with a person young or old that is talking about taking their life. We need to welcome our brother and sisters, and if they wear tennis shoes with their red dress so be it. Don't tell them about the rules, try to find out the reason first.

On things we don't need

To impress people, we don't like

God give us ten rules to live a good life, those rules work at being a good Marine Corps League member also.




